Our Philosophy

The foundation of our service is the science of applied behavior analysis (ABA). We are committed to providing an effective and individualized teaching program for each child.

Research has consistently shown, that behaviour intervention during the early stages of a child's development, is essential to maximizing learning potential and increasing the child's success in adjusting to his/her environment in the future. Our task as clinicians is to facilitate this learning in a supportive environment to achieve the best learning outcomes for the child and family.

Parents play a very important role in teaching and are an essential member of their child's EIBI team. Our goal is to train parents to set up learning environments that provide their child with many opportunities to learn and practice new skills in a variety of family and community contexts.

We also emphasize continuing education for all of our team members to ensure that they are providing the most effective interventions for the children and families they serve.



Early Intensive Behaviour Program (up to 6 years of age)

Laurel Behaviour Support Services is proud to offer Early Intensive Behaviour Intervention Services using the **Autism Curriculum Encyclopaedia (ACE)** developed by **The New England Center for Children (NECC)**, a leader in the field of applied behaviour analysis and autism. The ACE provides an interactive database containing assessment tools, lesson plans, teaching materials, and student performance reports for over 1,300 skills, drawn from the curriculum used at NECC. With ACE, the consultant is able to assess, teach and evaluate progress using evidence-based procedures.

ACE provides the consultant with access to applied behaviour analytic procedures and makes it possible for consultants to develop individualized evidence-based curriculum for the student with maximum efficiency, while reducing the overall cost of service to the family.



Core Elements of our EIBI Program

1. Curriculum assessment and programming is guided by the science of applied behaviour analysis and addresses all developmental domains:
 - *Communication*
 - *Academics*
 - *Social and Play Skills*
 - *Physical Development (fine and gross motor skills)*
 - *Independence and Life Skills*
2. A functional approach to problem behaviour.
3. A family-centered approach that includes parent training and involvement.
4. Comprehensive training to behaviour interventionists who are part of the child's teaching team.
5. Assistance with transition to pre-school.
